

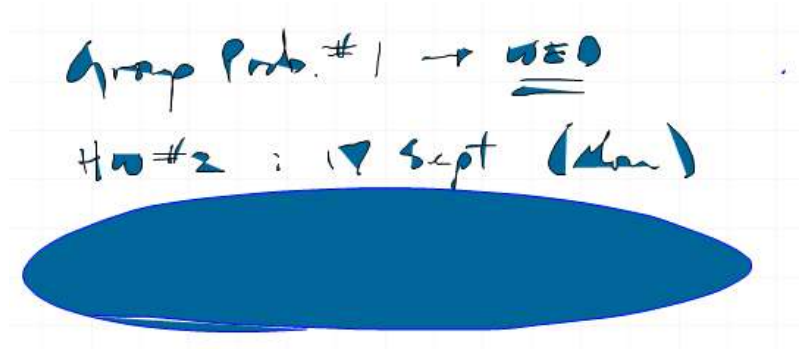
## Add and Save Annotation to PowerPoint 2007 Slide Show

### Problem:

You draw or write on slides while you are editing them.

All the loops are filled with a color.

You want just the writing to show.



### Solution:

Instead of drawing on your slides while you are editing them, use a pen during the slide show. During the slide show, the arrow can be changed for the pen by the shortcut Control + P, then back to the arrow with Control + A. A whole list of these shortcuts can be seen during the slide show by right clicking and choosing help.

As you write with the pen on each slide (called annotating) the annotations stay on each slide. At the end of the show, you are asked if you want to keep the notes or not.
